Humana Challenges Vour Wellbeing



t's a common phrase: All good things must come to an end. But for the Humana corporation, one of the nation's largest publicly traded health and supplemental-benefits companies, the phrase has evolved into a more positive credo: All great things can only get better. By definition, that means change.

Humana is the first to acknowledge that change is hard for some to embrace. So before the generation that grew up watching, volunteering and playing in the Bob Hope Classic tosses a club in frustration and worries unnecessarily about the tournament's iconic namesake, rest assured that Humana feels much the same way. The company considers Bob Hope a symbol of good health and longevity, and recognizes him as one of the Tour's forefathers. Humana has vowed to keep Hope's legacy alive and thriving in a partnership that is redefining the Classic.

All of which leads up to a name change for the Bob Hope Classic. Changing the name to the Humana Challenge was the first step in creating an entirely new PGA tournament experience. Not only will professional golf be front and center, so will Humana's goal to bring the concepts of health and fitness to people of all ages. For the first time at a golf tournament, spectators will have access to healthy concession options, pedometers for measuring steps taken and calories burned, and a family-fit area. There will even be oncourse wellness activities.

A golfer himself, Humana Chairman and CEO Mike McCallister is thrilled about the evolution of the event. "The concept of health, fitness and wellbeing is going to have to be at the core of changing what's happening in this country from a healthcare-cost perspective and from a personal health perspective," he says. "Tim Finchem [PGA Tour Commissioner]





and I have talked over the years about how golf is unique, in that the fans actually get up and walk and follow the players. The Humana Challenge gives us a wonderful launch pad to take a positive message and start working on the idea of behavior modification for everyone as a key component of the long-term health of this nation."

Humana raised the bar high, but it can go higher still when you consider the company's partnership with the Clinton Global Initiative (CGI), a project of the Clinton Foundation. Suddenly, the Humana Challenge is akin to a global summit meeting. During the week of the Humana Challenge, American leaders from business, nonprofits and government will converge upon the Coachella Valley to develop new ideas for creating jobs.





"CGI members have improved the lives of more than 300 million people around the world," says President Clinton. "We form partnerships to take action on issues that matter most, which is why I am pleased that the Clinton Foundation, the PGA Tour and Humana are working together to promote healthy lifestyles. The tournament builds on my personal love for golf, preserving the Bob Hope Classic legacy and the Clinton Foundation's commitment to healthy choices."

Equally pleased with the partnership is Linda Hope, daughter of the legendary entertainer. "My dad has been such an integral part

of golf and charity in the Coachella Valley, so our family is pleased that the tournament will continue to tell his remarkable story. I know that Dad would be enthusiastic about the tournament's new focus on health and wellbeing, but he'd probably add some laughter to the mix—these components, after all, coupled with a passion for golf, were the secrets to his century of a well-lived life."

Tournament Director Larry Thiel could not be happier. "There are so many new elements and additions to this event, it truly is groundbreaking," he says. What will not change is the tournament's commitment to local charities throughout the Coachella Valley as well as to the Eisenhower Medical Center.

Thiel's excitement is apparent, and he's ready for any challenges that may arise. "My job is to make the transition smooth for everyone involved," he says. "This the first time Humana and the Clinton Foundation have ever been involved in a golf tournament, and they are excited, totally committed and ready to do whatever they can to make this the absolute finest tournament in the world."

If you're still uncertain about the changes, think of it this way: Why not learn to improve your overall wellbeing while watching professional athletes compete in an event that honors an entertainment icon and raises funds for local charities? You can do all that and more at one incredible event—the Humana Challenge.

Humana Challenge What In a Name?

New name, new format for an iconic desert classic


ere are a few things you should know about the 2012 Humana Challenge: Yes, it is the tournament formerly known as the Bob Hope Classic. Yes, it will be held the third week of January, its traditional spot on the PGA Tour schedule—Jan. 19-22 to be exact.

Yes, it will be played on three courses: PGA West Palmer Private, PGA West Nicklaus Private and La Quinta Country Club.

No, you will not have to make adjustments to your weekly golfin order to attend the first round on Wednesday.

In the past, there were two types of golf fans: those who lived in the Coachella Valley and realized through years of repetition that their five-round event began on Wednesday, and those who did not. The latter was the group who arrived home from work or came off the golf course on that exact Wednesday in January only to realize the first round of that week's PGA Tour event was already in the record book. The former were








conditioned for five rounds of competition and never missed the first round—yet they also knew that changes to the tournament were likely, even necessary, to keep it as a staple on the PGA Tour's January calendar.

In the Hope's glorious past, PGA Tour players loved coming to the desert's annual competition/party for many reasons, the most popular being the opportunity to rub elbows with the greatest entertainers of the time; the great parties that included players, amateurs and celebrities; and the opportunity to knock the rust off their game with a five-round event that guaranteed plenty of time to acclimate to Tour intensity.





But the relentless tide of time eroded many of the pillar attractions. Bob Hope himself eventually and inevitably became less active in the tournament in his twilight years. Many of his contemporaries who had helped make the tournament the swanky, one-of-a-kind event it was were gone before Mr. Hope's passing in 2003. In the late 1990s, players began to make moviestar money, rendering the entire concept less appealing to both players and organizers. A majority of top-ranked players began to skip the event because a five-round tournament, combined with



the extracurricular demands on the time of successful modern touring professionals and celebrities, compressed what were already watertight personal and professional schedules.

When Louisville, Kentucky-based healthcare provider Humana, Inc. entered into the title sponsorship role just months ago, the writing on the wall was clear: changes to the tournament being considered, mentioned or planned had to be implemented quickly or removed from consideration. Organizers moved swiftly. They updated the tournament's name to reflect the new

sponsorship and they changed the format, eliminating the five-round/Wednesday start in favor of a traditional 72-hole event.

Humana Challenge tournament chairman Larry O. Thiel said the transition wheels have been turning since last summer when negotiations with Humana reached an advanced stage. The decision to make the tournament a four-round event came early on. Tournament staff has since dialed in to other important matters, such as signage, building bridges with Humana and integrating the Clinton Foundation Global Initiative into the tournament structure and Thiel says former President Bill Clinton won't just be a passive observer of the tournament.

"He is a charming guy to be around, and the thing that makes me most enthusiastic is that he's engaged," Thiel says. "He really, really wants this to be something special, the way it was when Mr. Hope was a part of it."

Of course, changes to the professional competition meant changes to the beloved Pro-Am, which was perhaps the most intimidating part of the transformation for organizers. But Thiel notes that after spending years trying to cultivate as many as 30 big-name stars and a full field of amateurs, this year's tournament will be limited to 18 celebrities, and they and the 144 amateur competitors will play for the first three rounds before ceding the spotlight to the pros.

Thiel says the amateurs should enjoy the new format even more as they can now play together as a team for all 54 holes. Each amateur pair will also play with two different pros each round, meaning each amateur will play with six different professionals during their three rounds. The celebrities will be split into groups of six and dispersed to the three different courses each day. In the past, all the celebrities played at the same course on the same day.


The new system seems to be working. Thiel says the 2012 Humana pro-am is already sold out. There are also two other pro-ams scheduled: The Legacy Pro-Am will be conducted the Monday of the tournament on the PGA West Palmer Private Course, featuring 104 amateurs and 26 professionals, and couples will battle it out in the Couples Challenge Pro-Am the Wednesday of tournament week.

Perhaps the second most-difficult decision was the one to remove Bob Hope's name from the tournament's title. While many old-timers, purists and sentimentalists weren't happy about it given that it's likely the tournament would have never caught on were it not for Hope, they were resigned to the fact that change was inevitable. And if a corporate sponsor was willing to put its marketing dollars to work through the event that had meant so much to the valley and it's charities for over 50 years, a title change was perhaps a small concession. Still, organizers have vowed to maintain the connection with Hope, the most visible aspect of that commitment coming on the nameplate on the Bob Hope Trophy, which forthwith will be awarded to the Humana Challenge champion.

Desert Willow

Enviable views, championship courses and amenities earn Palm Desert's city venue "resort" status

ith 36 holes of championship golf, stunning views, luxurious clubhouse amenities, patio dining and notable cuisine, Desert Willow Golf Resort could be a private club or part of a vacation retreat. Surprisingly, the appealing venue with luxury overtones is run by the City of Palm Desert, Calif. In a golf-saturated area with 130 venues competing for customer loyalty, Desert Willow regulars tell staffit's their favorite desert course.

The resort noticeably displays impeccable maintenance and offers incredible scenery. "We hear, 'This is the most beautiful of all the desert courses we've ever played," says Bruce Nation, Desert Willow's director of sales and marketing. Designed by Michael Hurdzan, who is known for environmentally friendly concepts, and former University of Arizona golfer Dana Fry, Desert Willow opened in 1997 with Firecliff, a championship layout with 18 challenging holes. "It's a real desert-style course with forced carries off the tee boxes, desert landscaping and skirted palm trees that have an oasis look of old-style palm trees in their most natural state," says Nation.



Mountain View course isn't a mirror image of its predecessor, but rather a sister design with its own persona. "The water features and bunker complexes on both courses are a lot alike, and there are great mountain views on each one as well," says Nation. "Firecliff plays a bit over 7,000 yards and Mountain View a shade under."

Mountain View's more forgiving fairways ease its difficulty quotient and Nation says it sometimes faces an image problem but only because of its less-than-fiery name. "We fall into the name trap," he says. "Mountain View is not as flashy a name as Firecliff, but it's just as good a golf course."

Palm Desert's city-run golf haven is basking in the glow of a sparkling \$4.5 million makeover completed in January 2010. Refreshments included the addition of 25,000 square feet to the clubhouse with outside additions such as new fire pits and stylish patio seating, plus upgrades in the kitchen. Mountain View course was spruced up as well, including upgraded greens, fairway bunkers and lake edges. Desert Willow's Palm Desert Golf Academy is a fullservice practice facility offering private lessons and custom club fittings year-round.

"We're a golfing destination," says Nation. "And we have great food and beverage on property. We hired a brand-new chef a year

ago and he tweaked the menu, which is changed every four to five months." Golfers can dine on entrées at lunch such as lobster macaroni-and-cheese, in addition to gourmet sandwiches and favorites for breakfast as well. "We have a nice bar and ambience, and patio dining is our specialty here," Nation adds. Desert Willow's scenic venue is the site of weddings and social functions, and the course hosts a jazz night twice a month with a menu of drinks and appetizers from January through May.

Desert Willow's Platinum Club Card loyalty program provides golfers with reduced greens fees for up to three guests, as well as secure tee times 21 days in advance, and discounts on lessons, select apparel and dining. "We pride ourselves in



being customer-service oriented," says Nation. "We may not be a five-star resort, but we're definitely in the four-star range. Our staff is outstanding and we do a lot of events—plus 87,000 rounds a year."

o play golf at Porcupine Creek in Rancho Mirage, Calif., requires a personal invitation by owner and Oracle cofounder Larry Ellison. But with dedicated organizers and a deserving cause, the second annual Childhelp Celebrity Golf Invitational, Jan. 8-10, offers tournament participants a rare opportunity to play the course during the first public fundraiser ever held there. The event features a second day of spectacular golf at the Celebrity Course at Indian Wells Golf Resort. Hosted by avid celebrity golfers Cheryl Ladd and John O'Hurley, the tournament not only aids a worthy nonprofit, it offers many things players covet: two days of unbeatable golf, a stellar celebrity list and three nights of fun-focused parties.

Ken Rizzotto, executive director of the tournament, has managed a spectrum of golf events. "Iknow this tournament will be an awesome golf experience for our participants," he says. "Players can step up for Childhelp and play an exclusive venue, a win-win opportunity. We'll be adding some new, high profile celebrities to the desert as our event takes place during the Palm Springs International Film Festival. It's going to be a wonderful three days. We're not going to be black-tie, but desert chic—you don't have to put on a monkey suit to enjoy great parties."

Three nights of festivities take place at the Hyatt Grand Champions Resort in Indian Wells, beginning with a '50s-themed pairings event on Sunday. A celebrity joins each amateur foursome, and team numbers are drawn on stage in front of the crowd. "It's luck of the draw," says Rizzotto. "Fair for one, fair for all. Even though we're an amateur tournament, it's important for us to uphold the integrity of the game of golf and make sure everything we do is above board. We want players to witness the drawing."

The Monday night party is geared toward fundraising for Childhelp, with live and silent auctions plus a variety of food and entertainment. The final night "Golf Ball" awards gala will be



headlined by Sensations show band. "It's going to be a blast, we're going to rock the Valley," Rizzotto says. "We'll only have 18 teams on each course each day, which will make the pace of play faster and a more pleasurable experience for the golfers. Porcupine Creek is truly a unique experience. I can't stress how special it is." Golfers are encouraged to put together their own foursomes and a team draw is available for singles. Rizzotto calls the five-player scramble handicap system "level" for all teams.

Tournament beneficiary Childhelp is dedicated to helping severely abused and at-risk children through treatment, prevention, education and advocacy. Judy Jensen, Childhelp western regional chapter coordinator, says, "These children, who have seen the worst that life has to offer, deserve the best that we can provide while they are in the care of Childhelp, including the support to become good citizens."

The Childhelp Merv Griffin Village has been in Beaumont, Calif., for over 30 years, and is one of two Childhelp residential treatment facilities providing specialized, comprehensive programs for court-referred, severely abused, neglected and at-risk children. The second facility is in northern Virginia. Jensen says tournament participants can put a face with their monetary contributions. "Each golfer will wear a bracelet with the name of a child, made by the children from the Village, and their anonymous stories are placed on each of the golf carts." The Childhelp Merv

Griffin Village Choir will perform for participants at the awards gala.

"We are a national organization with foster care, group homes, adoption, community centers, advocacy centers and a 24/7 hotline (800.4.A.CHILD, 800.422.4453), which serves the United States, Canada, U.S. Virgin Islands, Puerto Rico and Guam," says Jensen. The hotline was established in 1982 and is staffed by professional crisis counselors who can provide assistance in 170

languages. It offers crisis intervention, information and referrals to thousands of emergency, social service and support resources. "As more people and celebrities become involved," adds Jensen, "it will bring more awareness to what's going on in our country, and children will know they can get help. We are calling our golf tournament 'a vacation with a vision.""

Rizzotto says, "The combination of being able to come out and play a special golf course you'd never get to play, along with the wonderful Celebrity Course at Indian Wells, plus being able to enjoy beautiful festivities and the camaraderie of friends, and help children—I don't know if it gets any better."

2012 Waste Management Phoenix Open

Veteran Mark Wilson prepares to defend his title



uring the beginning of the 2011 PGA Tour season, longtime Tour professional Mark Wilson was *on fire*. He began the season with a two-stroke victory over Tim Clark and Steve Marino at the Sony Open in Hawaii for his first win in nearly two years. Less than a month later, he shot a six-under-par 65 during the first round of the Waste Management Phoenix Open and never looked back, finishing with rounds of 64, 68 and 69 to tie Jason Dufner at 18-under-par. With a birdie on the second sudden-death playoff hole, Wilson captured his second Tour victory in three starts, which led to an early lead in the FedEx Cup standings as well as on the PGA Tour money list.

Although Wilson's game cooled down during the remainder of the season and he didn't have another Tour win, many of his competitors and fans would not be surprised if he utilized his shortgame talents and shot-making precision to win again when the 2012 Waste Management Phoenix Open is played Feb. 1-5. In doing so, he would become only the sixth golfer in the tournament's 80-year history to successfully defend the title, joining the likes of Arnold Palmer, Ben Hogan and Johnny Miller.

As Wilson prepares to possibly join such an elite group, golffans across the country, and especially within the greater Phoenix area, will be anxiously anticipating one of the most exciting and popular Tour events of the season.

TPC of Scottsdale's Stadium Course, which has hosted the Phoenix Open every year since 1987, has become world-renowned for its par-three 16th hole, perhaps the most crowded—and loudest—spectator hole in professional golf.

The 16th hole is the only fully enclosed hole on the PGA Tour, inviting enthusiastic fans of all ages to its grandstands to witness the shot-making prowess of some of the Tour's most elite members. Fans also enjoy the drama of toe-to-toe tournament finishes, chip-





ins and the occasional, miraculous shot that leads to the most applause—the hole-in-one, which has been achieved only by a rare few in the past 24 years, among them Tiger Woods.

Due to the atmosphere of this hole, as well as the impressive field of the world's top golfers, including Phil Mickelson and Vijay Singh, the tournament has drawn some of the largest crowds in the sport over the last few years. On average, roughly 500,000 fans attend the tournament throughout the week; in 2008, the tournament actually set two Tour attendance records: single day, with more than 170,000 individuals enjoying the action during the third round, and week-long, as 538,356 fans were on hand from Thursday through Sunday.

In addition to the live tournament action, many attendees enjoy the Coors Light Birds Nest, an outdoor party tent and nightclub that has hosted a variety of popular bands in the past, including O.A.R., Huey Lewis and the News, and Hootie and the Blowfish.

The Birds Nest opens only during the week of the Phoenix Open, from Wednesday through Saturday. General admission cost is usually \$25, while a VIP admission badge can be purchased each night for \$150. Attendees may also buy a 10-pack of VIP tickets a total of 40 tickets, 10 for each night—for \$5,000. By purchasing a VIP badge, fans can enjoy a viewing platform of the stage, a private area including bathrooms and a full buffet featuring an assortment of menu items.

With its young, hip crowd, renowned 16th hole and grandstands, live entertainment and typically beautiful weather, there is little wonder why the Waste Management Phoenix Open is the most attended tournament on the PGA circuit year after year.

Fast, challenging greens and a 7,216-yard layout will test the skills of all tournament competitors, no matter how well they may

be playing at the time. And that's exactly why numerous former major champions, including Geoff Ogilvy and Y.E. Yang, as well as up-and-comers such as Rickie Fowler and Webb Simpson, frequently compete to test their patience and nerves in arguably the most exciting regular tournament of the year.

Through its upbeat, party-like atmosphere, attractive attendees (including local college and university students) and enviable field of past Tour winners, the Waste Management Phoenix Open is a *must-see event*, especially if you are near the Phoenix area.


Instruction by Tom F. Stickney II Free Up Your Backswing Turn Making adjustments to your game as you get older

Sadly, we are all getting older and our flexibility isn't what it used to be, which means our distance off the tee typically diminishes as time goes on. It's easy to see this phenomenon in the difference between players on the PGA Tour and those on the Senior Tour.

While the kids on the PGA Tour have tight, controlled backswings, the players on the Senior Tour are a different story. Examine them and you will see longer and freer turns to the top. This is due to the flexibility difference we all experience from 25 years of age to where we

are now. In this article, we help you understand how to free up your backswing for more distance.

For the PGA Tour Professional, the key is consistency over four days week after week, with less regard for distance because most players on this Tour have no distance issues. However, if you look at the Senior Tour, it is just the opposite. As these players have aged and their bodies have changed, they must amend their golfswing—and equipment—in order to hit the ball as far as they can most of the time



PGA TOUR PROFESSIONAL AT THE TOP

On left you see the look of the average PGA Tour Professional at the top of the swing, a player who is not concerned with distance production off the tee. The major points to notice are:

Wider stance: Promotes more balance and more controlled foot and leg action

Flexed rear knee: Keeps the hips from overrotating en route to the top

Minimal hip rotation to the top: Helps create the X factor, or torque, between the upper and lower body turns to the top

Extreme width of the arms: Helps widen the arc of the swing and keeps the arm-swing shorter for more accuracy

Big shoulder turn at the top: Coupled with a restricted hip turn, this creates the torque between the upper and lower body, which creates distance through resistance

It is these five points that help the PGA Tour player maximize control and produce the necessary distance to compete with long hitters like Bubba and Phil. Thus, if distance isn't a concern for you, then you should strive to tighten your backswing motion in some or all of the manners listed above.

However, if you're aging and your distance production isn't what it used to be, I suggest modifying the points above. One thing to keep in mind: Whenever you allow your swing to become longer and more flowing to the top (think of the swing of the late Payne Stewart), you will find that though you can indeed produce more distance, your accuracy will be slightly compromised. But if you are a shorter hitter and can't reach the par 4s and 5s in regulation anyway, then who cares? In my opinion it's much more fun to be putting for birdie, even if you hit offline sometimes.

FREE BACKSWING TURN TO THE TOP

The player who wants more distance, but has lost the ability to turn to the top, should study the photo above and make note of the following fundamental changes that can be adopted:

Moderate stance width at address: Unlike a wide stance, which restricts motion to the top, a moderate stance makes turning easier. You'll have to experiment. The more narrow the stance, the easier and fuller the backswing turn will become; however, you can lose your balance if you overdo it.

Rear foot rotated slightly outward at address: Rotate your rear foot outward a few inches and it will free up your hips on the way back.

Rear knee and hip action to the top: Look at the photo. With your stance and rear foot in this position, you will be able to rotate your hips to the top—and it will feel more like it used to when swinging. You might even feel a slight straightening of the rear knee to the top; this is OK, as long as you don't overdo it. Having this lowerbody freedom on the way back allows your shoulders to rotate fully.

Softer arms at the top: Notice I said "softer" not "collapsing" arms at the top. As flexibility wanes, you must get the club to the top further than before so you have time to produce distance on the way down. If you have a short, wide swing that keeps the clubhead vastly short of parallel at the top, then you will not have time to produce clubhead speed on the way down. Softer arms at the top will help.

Full-shoulder turn: Now that your stance, feet, hips and arms have been modified, you should feel like your back is to the target, just like you see on TV. This full-shoulder turn keeps the engine of the swing (your core) moving like a boat slinging a water skier (your arms) through the turn on the way down.

Change is inevitable as you get older, and in golf that means losing distance. Golf is no fun if you cannot reach the fairways or greens from the same tees as your usual playing partners. This loss of distance places too much pressure on your short game and putting in order to shoot a reasonable score, which means making a change is necessary. Try the changes I listed above, and I'm sure you will recover a few yards of that lost distance.

t's the holiday season and that means new golf equipment and new golf toys. And for you golfers living in warmer climates, it's an extra special time. On Christmas day, or as soon as you can get clearance, you can try out the new goodies. Here's what to request. Or give. Or buy with valuable gift card monies.

DRIVERS

The Ping G20 (\$299) is popular with professionals and weekend golfers alike; Ping markets the driver as being for all levels. The key is the perimeter weighting and high launch 9.0 with low spin. The clubhead is slightly heavier and uses a special stock shaft to counter the extra weight. The Taylor Made R11 (\$399) is fully adjustable so you can change launch angle and face angle. Experiment with the club on, or immediately after, December 25, or hand it to an experienced clubfitter for maximum distance. The white crown and black clubface help to make the R11 especially easy to align. The **Tour** Edge Bazooka GeoMax 2 is a tremendous deal with a great street price (around \$69). Tour Edge offers significant technology for a sensible price, and this club is proof of that; it provides almost all the technology of newer models. Power in the GeoMax 2 comes from four weighted cavities in the sole. One caveat: you'll have to hurry as it's being discontinued. You'll see a number of Tour players using the Titleist 910 D2 (\$399). It's tempting to say this club is for better players; however, midhandicappers will also benefit from features like the ultra-thin crown design that helps to promote a low center of gravity for medium/high launch for optimum distance.

HYBRIDS

Only five years ago it was rare to see a touring professional use a hybrid, but today, just about every pro uses one. If you haven't joined the hybrid club you may be convinced by one of these. The **Cobra Baffler Rail H** (\$99) features a rail sole design that makes the club glide over good lies and creates stability from really bad lies. For the ultimate in hybrid technology, turn to the company that essentially started the revolution, Adams. The **Adams a12 Pro** (\$199) has a hot face and improved forgiveness.

IRONS

A good New Year's resolution would be to hit more greens and that means new irons. If you're a better player, or if you're aiming to lower that handicap in 2012, try the **Mizuno MP-69s** (\$899). These are classic muscleback irons but with some forgiveness; the grainflow forging provides superb feel. If you want maximum forgiveness in your irons, go for the **Callaway RAZR X** irons (\$699). Callaway calls its 'RAZR Technology' the next generation of iron design—providing excellent forgiveness with significant workability.

WEDGES & PUTTERS

On the rare occasions you miss a green, a solid wedge is a must. The beat rolls on at Cleveland with the **Cleveland CG15 Oil Quench Tour Zip** (\$119), which has a traditional shape but is packed with impressive technology. This wedge has a laser-milled face for the maximum allowable spin, as well as the Cleveland GolfZip Grooves. As we allknow, whether we choose to admit it or not, the putter is ultimately the most important club in the bag. If you're really serious about lowering your scores and you want to give yourself a wonderful golfgift, then a customfitted putter is perfect. A good choice is the recently introduced **Ping Karsten 1959** (about \$99), with the classic Anser shape. The elastomer insert provides improved feel, but real results come from having the putter custom-fitted. Contact your local PGA professional for a fitting session.



SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE

The holiday season is a good time to get juniors into the game, and most of the major manufacturers make excellent junior sets. A good one is the **Callaway Golf X Junior SIX- Piece Set** (\$199), which provides the same technology as the adult X models.


If new golf apparel is on the agenda, the **Tehama Women's V**-Neck Argyle Sweater Vest (\$55) has the classic argyle print. If there's a trip to Scotland or Ireland coming up in 2012, you'll need to invest in waterproofs. Start your quest for outerwear that will stand up to the worst the British Isles can throw at you with the FootJoy DryJoys Performance Light Jacket (\$170); it comes with a two-year limited waterproof warranty.

Speaking of playing in the rain, or even just especially hot temps, golfers find that maintaining a solid grip can be difficult. The **iTac2 Sports Grip** comes from Australia, and it originated surprisingly in the sport of fitness pole dancing. iTac is made from organic beeswax and will not build up on the grips. It's a good stocking stuffer.

A few years ago, most golfers were hunting and pecking for yardage markers. Today, technology has provided golfers with several ways to find exact distances. The latest GPS data is right out of a James Bond movie: the **Garmin Approach S1 Wrist Watch** (\$249) provides precise distances to the front, middle and back of the green—in a watch. It comes preloaded with 14,000 courses.

Enjoy the holiday season and the New Year, and remember to visit your local PGA or LPGA professional to help you improve your technique—and for top equipment fitting and advice.





Dining in the Valley

he heart of the desert's high season is upon us, and with the throngs of new and returning residents, the Coachella Valley beats with full fervor. Ready to serve and aiming to please, the region's vibrant dining scene reacts in kind.

Leon's Bar & Grill couldn't be kept down for long; just weeks after the popular eatery parted ways with its dual locations at the Indian Canyons Golf Resort, the restaurant re-opened under the same name at the Desert Princess Country Club in Cathedral City. Capri Restaurant experienced similar fortitude. Dressing up was also the order of autumn as three popular Valley restaurants enjoyed fall makeovers: **The Kaiser Grill** in the heart of downtown Palm Springs underwent an entire redesign to awe diners with an updated, open look coupled with an overhauled, sustainable menu. 

ACUMA ZDX Coupe, sedan or sport utility vehicle? You decide

he Acura ZDX is a shape shifter. You want the power of a sports car? Buckle into a 300 horsepower V-6 and enjoy. You want the spaciousness and comfort of an SUV? Take a run up to the mountains and put the allwheel drive to the test.

Acura's first-ever female designer, Michelle Christensen, brought the ZDX to life in 2009. Christensen balanced the masculine and feminine design elements well in the aggressive front end and rounded rear fenders. The six-speed automatic has so many options to choose from, you'll wonder if you're driving something that came straight out of a James Bond movie.

In its new design studio in Torrance, Calif., Acura went to work using a new team approach. The interior and exterior teams worked together. It seems like common sense, but this doesn't happen often in the auto industry. The result is a car that drives like a roadster when you want it and like an ocean liner when you're in the mood for sailing.

Quiet, responsive and sporty are thoughts that might come to you as you drive the ZDX around town. The Integrated Dynamics System (IDS) system engages shock absorbers in order to customize the drive to your demands. In comfort mode, the



ZDX requires less effort to steer and rides like a magic carpet. In sport mode, you're ready to race Le Mans.

Three hundred horsepower doesn't have to accompany a car with a perpetual appetite for fuel. The ZDX is getting 23 mpg on the highway with approximately the same wheelbase and curb weight of a Porsche Cayenne. The ZDX has a 21-gallon gas tank that allows for a mega trip without having to refuel. All-wheel drive comes standard and makes the ride exceptionally sticky in the corners and snow.

Don't let the coupe fool you. You can easily fit a set of skis and snowboards the ZDS. This four-door has rear folding seats and enough cargo room to make a trip to the slopes or the golf course easy. The leather-stitched dash along with the glass roof gives the ZDX an unprecedented style factor that isn't typical Acura branding.

"The ZDX is like nothing you have ever seen before from Acura," Jeff Conrad, vice president of Acura sales, said in a statement. "It combines the best attributes of a coupe, a sedan and a sport utility—all wrapped in a beautifully sculpted package—that will attract an entirely new luxury customer to the Acura brand."



The style element is enhanced by the fact that it isn't a boxy machine devoid of frills like so many other crossovers that have died a painful death. Rather than load the car with auxiliary power jacks and faux camping accessories, Acura took time to deliver features that actually get used. The navigation system with realtime traffic and Zagat reviews is a cornerstone of the operating system. A sound system with a 15GB hard drive and iPod connection makes it practical and user-friendly. An optional Active Sound Control system reduces road noise by as much as 10dB using opposing sound frequencies through the audio-system speakers. These features put the price tag around \$56,000

The safety of the ZDX is the piece of this performance pie that makes it even sweeter. The Collision Mitigation Braking System could save lives. Powered by a radar transmitter mounted in the ZDX grille, a signal is constantly transmitted and the return signal is evaluated, determining the distance and closing speed to vehicles that lie directly ahead. If the distance between you and the vehicle ahead reduces, a warning signal is given to alert you to slow down. If the ZDX predicts that a collision is imminent, the seat belts are tightened and brakes applied immediately.

The ZDX is also loaded with Acura's blind-spot information system. The feature monitors the back half of the



ZDX where it is difficult for drivers to see other vehicles. When another car is traveling in that area, an indicator illuminates on that side of the ZDX on the windshield pillar. Nothing annoying, but enough to keep you from having a very bad day.

The ZDX has the power and grace to keep you comfortable and enjoying your daily commute. Do you want power or grace? I choose BOTH.
